Students Complete International Work Placements through Turing Scheme

Through the Turing Scheme, ten of our students at HRUC have successfully completed a month's work placement in Gqeberha in Port Elizabeth, South Africa.

The Turing Scheme is a UK government programme providing funding for international opportunities in education and training across the world.

Of this fortunate group, three RuTC students worked in townships where there is very high rates of poverty, unemployment, and HIV diagnoses. They worked in several schools through the United Through Sport charity model to provide coaching, teaching, swimming, and childcare to residents.

The students were working alongside international volunteers from the Netherlands, Belgium, Switzerland and Italy, where they were able to develop their social skills and ability to interact with individuals from different backgrounds. As well as this, involvement in the project provides a fantastic opportunity for our students to develop their organisational skills, confidence, professionalism, teamwork and understanding of new cultures.
