Travel and Tourism and Catering Students Take a Trip to Italy



Fifty of our Level 2 and 3 Travel and Tourism and Catering students, along with department staff members, took an exciting trip to the coastal towns of southwestern Italy earlier this year.

During the educational trip, students were based in Sorrento and immersed themselves in a rich tapestry of cultural experiences in the nearby towns. From the iconic central landmarks of Sorrento to the picturesque island of Capri, and the beautiful scenery of the Amalfi coast, they delved into the heart of Italian hospitality and tourism.

Through guided tours, and firsthand experiences, they learned about the intricate art of Italian cuisine, the nuances of hospitality management, and the diverse attractions scattered across the region. A-Level Philosophy, Religion and Ethics Students Tour Westminster Abbey

In April, a group of Philosophy, Religion and Ethics A-Level students at RuTC had the opportunity to visit Westminster Abbey, in central London.

Students were given a private tour of the Abbey with commentary from a guide. This involved seeing the graves of old Kings and Queens, as well as some of the most influential thinkers of our time, including Charles Darwin and Stephen Hawking.







Politics Students Visit Supreme Court



A-Level Politics students at RuTC visited the Supreme Court, in Parliament Square, in mid-April.

The trip began with a tour, where they first established the key differences between the features of a regular court and the Supreme Court, which consisted of cameras, no witness stands and the judges table being the same height as the defendant's table. They also learnt that the Supreme Court only enforces and states what the law is and does not provide judgements of guilt. The emblem of the Supreme Court was also explained, detailing that it consists of the different national flowers of all the countries in the UK: The Tudor rose for England, the thistle for Scotland, the leek for Wales and the flax blossom for Northern Ireland), to represent unity. It also consists of the Greek letter Omega, which symbolises finality.

They then had the opportunity to look at a court case, which involved a father taking their child to Disneyland during the school term. Discussing who they thought was lawfully right in the matter.

To end the day, the learners got the chance to sit in on an actual court hearing, which was a case about releasing information on doctors who were involved in the withdrawing of treatment of a patient.

It was a hugely informative and inspirational trip for our students!

RuTC Alumnus, Adele James, Stars in National Theatre Production

One of our fantastic RuTC alumnus, Adele James, starred in 'Underdog: The Other Other Brontë' at the National Theatre, on London's South Bank, earlier this term.

The new play was an irreverent retelling of the life and legend of the Brontë sisters, and the story of the sibling power dynamics that shaped their uneven rise to fame. Adele played the role of Emily Brontë in the production, alongside actors Gemma Whelan and Rhiannon Clements.

Adele studied BTEC Acting during her time at RuTC, leaving in 2013 to go on to study BA (Honours) Drama at the University of Bristol. In her professional career she has starred in the long-running BBC drama, Casualty, as regular character, 'Tina Mollett'. Last year, Adele landed the lead role of 'Cleopatra' in the Netflix series, 'Queen Cleopatra', for which she won the 'Outstanding Performance' award at the National Film Awards 2023.

Congratulations, Adele!








Early Years Students Visit Disneyland Paris

RuTC students, Monica Pirvu and AJ Ndong Ngonde, did a fantastic job of chairing the event, where all candidates answered a series of tough questions posed by our learners, staff and audience.

Candidates introduced themselves with three-minute speeches, outlining their party's aims and values on key issues. Pre-submitted questions from A-Level Politics students were then read out to the candidates, who were given one minute each to answer these. These questions highlighted issues such as stop and search, the Rwanda bill, the general election, and sustainable transport. Members of the crowd were also given the opportunity to ask questions to the candidates, covering topics including the ongoing genocide in Ethiopia, advice to their younger selves, and the definition of 'woke'. The event concluded with another set of speeches, where the candidates commented on the day's discussion and encouraged votes for their parties.
